

#### Welcome to Guam




Hafa Adai (pronounced HALF a-DAY) is "Hello" in Chamorro, the native language of Guam and the islands of the Northern Marianas. It's a welcome greeting after the long flight from Los Angeles, a brief stop in Honolulu, then on to Guam where the travelers check into the Outrigger Hotel on the beachfront at the Tumon Bay resort district.

Guam is the largest and southernmost of the islands that form a part of the Mariana Islands. Its motto is: "Where America's Day Begins."

Nimitz Hill is the home of the United States Navy Commander Naval Forces Marianas, located in Asan on the southern half of Guam. It overlooks Agana Bay on its western edge.





Several Young Marines were on hand to interact with the veterans and to learn from them.





### Iwo Jima





Flight details for Iwo Jima are displayed at the airport before the morning departure. At left, Tom Campanelli deplanes upon arrival on the island. Today Iwo Jima is a naval air base for the Japan Maritime and Air Self-Defense Forces. It is off limits to tourists, aside from the "Reunion of Honor" memorial services once a year. When visitors deboarded, a group of active-duty Marines from Okinawa were on hand to assist them in getting around the island. At bottom, are Carl DeHaven (foreground) and Billy Griggs (far right).

Opposite, Mount Suribachi looms in the background from the landing beaches. Wreckage can still be seen in the waters off shore. Undoubtedly the most visited place on the island, Mount Suribachi today is the setting for many photos with outstretched American flags, Marine re-enlistments and a place to leave dog tags and other mementos as symbols of honor and remembrance.







### Reunion of Honor

LtGens Norm Smith, Larry Snowden and Hank Stackpole participate in the wreath-laying ceremony during the 2013 Reunion of Honor to honor the U.S. troops who fought and died on Iwo Jima in 1945. The occasion is a joint pilgrimage by both Americans and Japanese to the remote island 650 miles southeast of Tokyo. The stone monument was first placed there in 1985 for the 40th anniversary of the battle. The plaque features one side in English, facing the beaches where the Americans landed, and the other side in Japanese, facing inland.








Veterans, current Marines and other dignitaries all pay homage to the sacrifices of so many. It was a hard-fought, 36-day battle for the key real estate in island-hopping campaign in the Pacific during World War II. Once secured, the island served as a landing safeguard for the B-29 Superfortresses to provide fighter escort support on their missions to the Japanese mainland.







### Asan Beach



Travelers explore Asan Beach on Guam, with Adelup Point in Hagatna in the distance. It features a complex that houses the governor's office and the Latte of Freedom, a monument in the shape of a latte stone, which was a structure used by ancient Chamorros to support houses and meeting halls.






# Seeking past Reunion of Honor memories and photos


# Iwo Jima, 1945


